6 BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

- 6.1 Review from Finance Department regarding levy- response from Cheryl Tkacuck- Regarding a review of the actual amount of the levy. The Downtown Improvement levy that is recorded to PADBID is based on the actual \$ collected monthly. This is why there are fluctuations from the budgeted levy revenue each year. For instance, if we have a delinquent tax payer in this geographical area and 2 to 3 years of taxes were collected then 2 to 3 years of levy \$ is recorded as revenue at the time of collection, therefore increasing the revenue for that year. It will also work the other way if there is reduced collection, revenue will decrease for that year. The PADBID levy is reviewed each year to ensure that the levy provides the required revenue for your budget for 2021. The levy will be set at the same time as the other tax tools. 2021 is a revaluation year and assessment values will change which will impact everyone's property taxes.
